KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

We will be holding our Kindergarten Orientation for the 2023 Kindergarten students on Wednesday 12 and 19 October. Personal invitations will be sent out to all registered students later this term.

SWIM SCHEME

This year we have been able to secure a booking for the Department of Education Intensive Swimming Scheme in Term 4. This valuable10 day intensive program is for all level of swimmers from non-swimmers to the more competent students requiring stroke correction. The lessons are free, but there is a cost for pool entry and transport to and from the pool. Small schools are fortunate in that our students from Kindergarten up are able to participate. We will be sharing the bus to and from Castle Hill Aquatic Centre with Middle Dural which will cut costs on transport. More details will be sent home shortly.

SICKNESS

There is a lot of sickness in the school community at the moment. Thank you for keeping your sick ones at home. I am not sure if you are aware, but when you have a PCR Test at one of the centres, besides testing for COVID they are now indicating if the person has Influenza A/B or RSV (Respiratory syncytial virus). The latest information from the Department is as follows:

In light of continuing high COVID case numbers in the community, and the ongoing presence of other viral illnesses such as influenza and RSV, the department is continuing its COVID-smart measures for the remainder of Term 3.

These measures include the following:

- Students and staff must stay home if unwell and not return to school until symptom-free.
- Symptomatic students or staff members should take a rapid antigen test (RAT) and isolate until they receive a negative test result.
- Masks are strongly encouraged for all staff, students and school visitors, and continue to be mandatory for all staff working with students at greater risk of severe illness if they were to get COVID-19.

- Household or close contacts can only attend mainstream schools to learn or work if they
 are symptom-free, and they receive a negative RAT result and wear a mask (staff and high
 school students) for 5 consecutive school days.
- Visitors can come to school sites regardless of their vaccination status but may be required to wear a mask if in close proximity to students at greater risk of severe illness if they were to get COVID-19.
- Natural ventilation and personal hygiene continue to be encouraged.
- Events, gatherings and overnight excursions can go ahead. Risk assessments should be conducted to assist schools to make COVID-smart decisions based on their local contexts.
- Additional circuit breaker measures continue to be implemented at schools when needed, in conjunction with advice from the Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing case management team.

The P&C is an integral part of our school community. We are encouraging all families to attend either in person or via zoom at our next meeting on Tuesday 18 October at 7pm. Future social and fundraising ideas will be discussed.
